NOTICE OF APPLICATION

Name of applicant: The Bowra Group Inc. ("TBGI") in its capacity as Monitor (the "Monitor") of Alderbridge Way GP Ltd., Alderbridge Way Limited Partnership and 0989705 B.C. Ltd. (collectively the "Companies").

To: The Service List, a copy of which is attached hereto as Schedule "A"

TAKE NOTICE that an application will be made by the Applicant to the Honourable Madam Justice Fitzpatrick <u>VIA MS TEAMS</u> at the courthouse at 800 Smithe Street, Vancouver, B.C. on October 7, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. for the orders set out in **Part 1** below.

Part 1: ORDERS SOUGHT

1. An order in substantially the form of draft order attached hereto as <u>Schedule "B"</u> extending the Stay Period, as defined in the Second Amended and Restated Initial Order made by the Honourable Madam Justice Fitzpatrick in these proceedings on August 11, 2022 (the "SARIO"), and the other relief granted therein, from October 7, 2022 to December 10, 2022.

Part 2: FACTUAL BASIS

BACKGROUND

- 1. Capitalized terms used herein and not otherwise defined shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the SARIO.
- 2. On April 1, 2022, this Court made an order (the "Initial Order") under the *Companies' Creditors Arrangement Act*, R.S.C. 1985 c. C-36, as amended (the "CCAA"), granting the Companies protection from their creditors and authorizing the Companies to borrow up to \$850,000 by way of debtor in possession financing ("DIP Financing").
- 3. On April 11, 2022, this Court granted an Order extending the Stay Period to April 25, 2022.
- 4. On April 25, 2022, this Court granted the Amended and Restated Initial Order that, among other things:
 - (a) extended the Stay Period to August 3, 2022;
 - (b) substituted TBGI as Monitor in place of Alvarez & Marsal Canada Inc.; and
 - (c) approved an additional \$1.65 million of DIP Financing from Romspen Investment Corporation ("Romspen"), the Petitioners' senior secured creditor.
- Also on April 25, 2022, the Court granted an order (the "SISP Order") authorizing and directing the Monitor to carry out a sales and investment solicitation process (the "SISP") in respect of the development property at 7960 Alderbridge Way, 5333 and 5411 No. 3 Road, Richmond, British Columbia (the "Development Project").
- 6. On April 11, 2022, this Court granted an Order extending the Stay Period to August 12, 2022.
- 7. On August 11, 2022, this Court granted the SARIO, which, among other things:
 - (a) expanded and enhanced the Monitor's powers to, among other things, allow it to exercise control over the Development Project;

- (b) approved an additional \$2.5 million of DIP Financing to be advanced by Romspen and secured by a corresponding charge in favour of Romspen over the assets, property and undertakings of the Companies; and
- (c) extended the Stay Period to October 7, 2022.

THE CCAA SISP

- 8. Terms used in this section have the meanings ascribed to them in the SISP, a copy of which is attached as Schedule "B" to the SISP Order.
- 9. By the original Final Bid Deadline, the Monitor had received multiple Final Bids, however, none of the bids was adequately advanced so as to be acceptable to the Monitor and Romspen. The Monitor, in consultation with and with the consent of Romspen, determined that it was advisable to extend the SISP deadline in order to advance the SISP process.
- 10. The Monitor, with the consent of Romspen, extended certain of the SISP dates on eight occasions, most recently on October 5, 2022, such that the Final Bid Deadline is now October 31, 2022.
- 11. As of the date of the Monitor's Fifth Report to Court dated October 3, 2022 (the "Fifth Report"), the Monitor had not received any bids that were compliant with the SISP.

THE BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

- 12. In its Fourth Report to Court dated August 9, 2022, the Monitor advised this Court that the building permit for the Development Project had expired and that it was recommended that the Petitioners (by the Monitor) submit a new building permit application acceptable to the City of Richmond (the "City").
- 13. The Monitor remains of the view that it is imperative that an application for a new building permit be submitted immediately. The alternative scenario includes a loss of density and a resultant decrease in the estimated value of the Development Property, as well as a further delay of up to 18 months.

- 14. The Monitor has engaged certain code consultants and structural engineers (together, the "Consultants") to assess the changes that would be required for a new building permit application.
- 15. The building application process is taking longer than anticipated and, thus, an extension of the Stay Period is required to allow the Monitor to continue to work with the Consultants and the City to prepare an building permit application acceptable to the City.

EXTENSION OF THE STAY PERIOD AND NEXT STEPS

- 16. The Monitor seeks to extend the Stay Period until 11:59 p.m. on December 10, 2022. The Monitor recommends that this Court grant the order being sought, including for the following reasons:
 - (a) the SISP has, thus far, not led to an acceptable transaction and the extension of the Stay Period will provide more time to negotiate a transaction that is acceptable to the Monitor and Rompsen;
 - (b) further engagement with the City is prudent in the circumstances; a successful building permit application will preserve the value of the project and provide certainty for prospective purchasers;
 - (c) Romspen has consented to an extension of the Stay Period; and
 - (d) no creditor of the Companies will be materially prejudiced by the extension of the Stay Period being sought.

Part 3: LEGAL BASIS

- 1. The Monitor relies on ss. 11 and 11.02, of the CCAA and the inherent jurisdiction and statutory discretion of this Honourable Court.
- 2. Subsection 11.02(2) of the CCAA provides that a debtor company may apply for an extension of the stay of proceedings for a period of time that the court considers necessary on any terms that it may impose. Subsection 11.02(3) of the CCAA provides that the court shall not make an order extending the stay period unless it is satisfied that:

- (a) the circumstances exist that make the order appropriate; and (b) the debtor company has acted and is acting in good faith and with due diligence.
- 3. The extension of the Stay Period will enable the Monitor to use its enhanced powers to preserve the value of the Development Project and facilitate a suitable transaction to the benefit of the Petitioners' stakeholders.
- 4. It is appropriate to extend the Stay Period in the circumstances because: (a) Romspen, the Petitioners' senior secured creditor, has consented to the extension of the Stay Period as sought; (b) it is required to preserve the value of the Development Project to the benefit of the Petitioners' creditors; and (c) the Petitioners have been, and are, acting in good faith and with due diligence.

Part 4: MATERIAL TO BE RELIED ON

- 1. Monitor's Fourth Report to the Court dated August 9, 2022;
- 2. Monitor's Fifth Report to the Court dated October 3, 2022; and
- 3. Such further and other materials as counsel may advise and as this Court deems admissible.

The applicant estimates that the application will take 10 minutes.

This matter is not within the jurisdiction of a master.

TO THE PERSONS RECEIVING THIS NOTICE OF APPLICATION: If you wish to respond to this Notice of Application, you must, within 5 business days after service of this Notice of Application or, if this application is brought under Rule 9-7, within 8 business days after service of this Notice of Application,

- (a) file an Application Response in Form 33,
- (b) file the original of every affidavit, and of every other document, that
 - (i) you intend to refer to at the hearing of this application, and
 - (ii) has not already been filed in the proceeding, and

- (c) serve on the applicant 2 copies of the following, and on every other party of record one copy of the following:
 - (i) a copy of the filed Application Response;
 - (ii) a copy of each of the filed affidavits and other documents that you intend to refer to at the hearing of this application and that has not already been served on that person;
 - (iii) if this application is brought under Rule 9-7, any notice that you are required to give under Rule 9-7(9).
